DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT

2023-2024 was quite the year of change at the Octagon. The 3rd floor renovation project to create 5 private studio spaces for artists was completed! Special thanks to the City of Ames for the Arts Capital Grant Program and the amazing donors who made this project a reality. Welcoming artists into the Octagon to use the studios aligns with the Octagon mission to "encourage interaction and creative self-expression by providing inclusive opportunities and spaces that bring people together through art."

One of our goals at the Octagon is to use art as a way to connect with people and create community. This past May we held our first Art Sale. It was a great resource for people to pass along artwork as they redecorated or were downsizing. The public was able to provide new homes for the artwork at reasonable prices, and funds were used to help support art education programs. We will plan to bring back this event in Spring of 2025.

I want to acknowledge our wonderful staff, who pour their heart and energy into all of the programming here at the Octagon. Observing their passion for the arts is truly inspiring. We were thrilled to welcome Laura Teske this last year to serve as our Outreach Coordinator. The Octagon receives many requests for art outreach opportunities and Laura will greatly assist us with managing community engagement events.

We are excited for new opportunities to provide art experiences in the coming fiscal year. I welcome you to sign up for a class, volunteer for an event, view an exhibit or purchase some great gifts in the Octagon shop.

58 YEARS OF THE OCTAGON!



The Octagon Center for the Arts began as the dream for a special place to foster the arts in Ames, IA. In Late 1965, four incredible women came together to make their dream a reality. They rented the center's namesake octagonal house (shown below), drew up a logo like the one to the left, and scheduled classes and exhibits for the up

coming year. On January 23rd, 1966, with the help of many artists and volunteers, they opened the doors to an astounding 500+ person crowd! But It wasn't long before they outgrew their octagonal art center.

And we haven't stopped growing since! Though the octagon house no longer stands and times have changed, the Octagon Center for the Arts continues to be an integral part of arts education in Ames. With the addition of both co-working and private studio spaces, more class and workshop opportunities, and several new local artists displayed in the

shop, we are inspired every day by our four founders who had the vision and the passion to create something new for our community.

We're increasing the number of gallery exhibits, free community and outreach events, and welcoming more artists into our co-working and private studios. As we head into our 59th year, we will continue to provide impactful and engaging programs for our community.

THIRD FLOOR

The Co-working Studio!

At the beginning of the Third Floor Initiative in 2018, the Octagon decided that our Main Gallery's location on the 3rd floor as well as its large size was underutilized as simply a gallery space. We could do much more to support our area artists! One of the very first phases of the Initiative was to re-imagine the Main Gallery as a co-working studio.


It's now been three years that we have offered studio space in our Co-Working Studio. By keeping the original open floor plan, there is now potential for up to eight studio spaces along with a large, open communal work area for shared and collaborative work.



During the past year, the Co-working Studio has been home to five graduate students from the Iowa State University College of Design Integrated Visuals Arts program. These emerging artists are in their final semesters and we are so proud and grateful to be able to provide them studio space at this exciting time in their careers!

ARTIST STUDIOS

PRIVATE STUDIOS - FINALLY!



Private Artist Studios!

We are so excited to be able to finally offer five new studio spaces to our local artists! These studios range from 143 to 214 sqft and have 24/7 access with individually locking doors, ample outlet access, dimmable overhead LED lights, and large north facing windows. Two of the studios are equipped with independent ventilation units that are able to accommodate artists whose medium of choice might require higher ventilation, such as oil painting.

Studio #5 will be home to a Community Outreach artist. These artists will rotate out every 6 months, and will have a focus on community engagement and be involved with leading and organizing outreach events and workshops.



COMMUNITY GALLERY

This last year has simply flown by! In the gallery, it's been a whirlwind of show openings, receptions, gallery changes, and wall repairs. In August 2023, Katie DuVal Mihelich joined us as a gallery intern, but we quickly realized the incredible talent and passion she brought with her and we couldn't do without her. To my delight and relief, just a few months later Katie accepted a gallery assistant position. She has been instrumental when it comes to getting an exhibition prepared, I quite literally could not have gotten through the busy gallery season without her.

Each year we always want to try to improve upon the previous gallery season. Last year we added the Octagon Shop Winter Market into the annual mix, with real success! Then in May 2024, we implemented a new group show: the Iowa State Integrated Visual Arts Exhibition featuring the works of 11 MFA students.

Looking to next year already, I'm excited to implement a new schedule and flow to the gallery exhibitions. This upcoming gallery season, we'll be adding another group



show, similar to the annual Octagonal exhibition in March, but with a narrowed "theme". There will also be 2 additional show slots, resulting in a total of 14 show slots. I cannot wait to see how it all unfolds!

Once again Ames, the surrounding communities, and our fabulous members have chosen to support small businesses! Our fiscal year did not beat the previous 2 years in sales, but it was still clearly a strong year, graph shown to the right, as we once again topped \$100,000 in gross sales. The COVID pandemic was terrible and scary, and it is still with us, but we're continue to come together to share beauty with the world. We are so thankful for our artists and our community!

Speaking of our artists, this year we have nearly 190 artists that represented in the Shop, that is a lot of artists! We're so grateful to be a retail home for some many, but due to our limited physical space in the Shop, beginning in October 2024, we will only be jurying once per year for artists who'd like to consign.

We've also very lucky to bring Laura Teske on as staff. She is now extending into



other areas at the Octagon, but her help in the Shop has been incredible and monumental! Her eye for merchandising and work on cycling the shelves with new items from our artists has given the Shop a fresh new look.


Our Outreach Coordinator: Laura Teske

EDUCATION

The past year at the Octagon has been a period of growth, creativity, and community engagement. Our education programs continued to increase, offering over 36 combined classes, camps, workshops, and outreach programs to students of all ages that have reached a total of 1262 people! These programs have nurtured creativity, artistic and self expression, built community, and expanded creative skills for all of our participants.

Each semester, we work with student volunteers that are integral to prepping for arts programming, but especially for the children's art tent during our annual art



festival. This year's festival was record breaking, reaching 300 people with in-person and take-home activities!

Looking ahead, we continue to ensure that our offerings remain fresh, diverse, and responsive to community interests. We are deeply thankful to our instructors, volunteers, and supporters who have made our programs possible!

All Kinds of Art


All day workshops for children in Grades K – 5 during no-school days. Students can spend the day making a variety of different projects while learning about art!



Events are happening all the time! The Octagon Art Festival and the Business of Art Conference occur each year and are great opportunities to explore the art in our community.







